U.S.A.- What a History, What a Future!

As we recently celebrated Independence Day of our country, we now can boast of having a 247 year history of living under a democratic form of government, which is operated through our republic form of governing authorities.

What you may find most interesting is the study that was

done back in the 1700's by Lord Alexander Fraser Tytler, a Scottish lawyer, historian, professor, and writer. His research centered on the life cycle of a democracy, focusing on how long a democratic form of government could last. His research included studying historical democracies/republics such as the Athenian and Roman

empires. Interesting enough was learning that nearly all democracies failed within 200 years of their inception.

Lord Tytler is accredited for identifying the nine stages that democies evolve through, which today is referred to as, "The Tytler Cycle." The first stage is "bondage" where the people oppose the con-(Continued on the next page)

ditions that they live under. From bondage the people move to "spiritual faith" that unites them within a strong and deep moral commitment. Next comes "courage," where that people fight for freedom. The result from courage is the people attaining the stage of "liberty," where freedom to live and achieve by is attained. Then the fifth stage occurs, which is "abundance," where the attention of the people moves to material wealth. From abundance the people move into "selfishness," which is the sixth stage. The seventh stage is "complacency," which revolves around entitlement and selfabsorption. Next comes "apathy,"

where personal responsibility is lost. The final stage of the Tytler Cyle is "dependence." This is often referred to as "the point of no return" and is signified by the people having the right to vote themselves financial support from the public treasury. In fact, attributed to Lord Tytler is the statement, "A democracy will continue to exist until the voters discover that they can vote themselves generous gifts from the public treasury. From that moment, the majority will always vote for candidates who promise the most benefits from the treasury, leading to a government collapse due to loose fiscal policy."

The most frightening thought is that after all nine stages are complete, the people end back in "bondage." So I ask, what stage is our country in, now that we've existed 47 years beyond the average life-span of a democracy? Many economists claim that we've entered the stage of "dependence," following COVID.

There is one way to avoid falling back into the pain and suffering of bondage and that is through people moving into the stage of spiritual faith. As I've heard one instructor state, "The stage of spiritual faith is required to unite our nation, which has never been so badly divided." I agree, and more importantly, I believe that Lord Tytler has provided a loud wake up call for our nation.

Let's Get Practical: Becoming a Great Listener

Many in the professional realm of teaching good business practices often agree that the most difficult skill to teach people is how to become a great listener. And keep in mind that poor listeners don't necessarily do all of the talking; often they just aren't tuned in. So how do we assure ourselves of becoming better at the skill of listening? What follows are some motivational and skillful tips:

- 1. Follow Prado's 80/20 law: Listen 80% of the time and talk only 20%. The motivation is that you always need to be learning and you never learn unless the other person is talking. Speaking 20% of the time causes you to pick your words well and offer them at the perfect time.
- 2. Ask good questions, which requires some planning on your part. Getting everyone involved in the discussion builds trust, unity, and appreciation. Most importantly it provides you the time to listen, analyze, and build a sense of where people stand on any given subject.
- 3. Carry a token in your off-hand: Using a coin, a small agate, or anything similar will work. Holding it tight in your non-writing hand provides a physical reinforcement to listen much and speak little. After awhile, you'll get so good that you can just keep your token in your pocket.
