

Once our prayers were finished, I always felt led to make the point that we had prayed within God's will, that He clearly listened to our praise and petitions, and that it was going to be important for them to take action the following week in participating with the Lord on the delivery of His solutions. I promised them that significant things were going to happen and that I wanted them to let me know the following Sunday what they and God did together. You wouldn't believe that stories that I heard: Definite progress, if not the entire solution, was delivered, and it was through the actions that they took that the Lord revealed the answers to their prayers!

Another great analogy I recently heard concerning our need to move ahead with meaningful action in fulfilling

what God desires within our relationship is how one evangelist revealed the detailed design of the armor of God. He stated that there was no backside of God's armor, only what was to be worn on the front of our bodies. The reason? Because we don't go backwards in our journey, only forward!

I also heard a great quote from another pastor who spoke on the get moving subject when he said, "Trade your couch in for a good pair of running shoes. You'll live a longer and more product life!"

Do remember that the Lord is a lamp at your feet, meaning that as we take action and move ahead, pay constant attention to each step of the way so that you never overlook a special moment that the Lord has put in front of you.
